WORKING HARD TO FIX THE ISSUES IN WEST DERBY LEYFIELD STREET BY STREET

END THE BLIGHT

David Brookes-Lennon and the Lib Dems call for action on dereliction, decay and dirty streets in our communities



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Local residents have been telling David Brookes-Lennon and the Liberal Democrats that they are fed up with neglected sites, speeding traffic, anti-social behaviour and litter across Leyfield and West Derby.

From empty buildings to dangerous parking and speeding on residential roads, residents deserve better than being ignored.

Former Bellefield Care Home at 42 Aysgarth Avenue is currently empty, with security signage in place. Residents have raised concerns about the future of the site and want to see it properly maintained, monitored and brought back into positive use.

David Brookes-Lennon said:

"Residents are understandably concerned when a building is left empty and starts to look neglected. Empty sites can quickly become an eyesore if they are not properly maintained."

"There has also been misinformation locally about the future of this site, which has caused unnecessary worry. Residents deserve facts, not rumours."

"My focus is simple: the site should be brought back into use in a way that benefits the local community."

10,000 EMPTY HOMES CAN'T BE RIGHT?

- » There are 14,000 people on Liverpool's housing waiting list and over 10,000 empty properties in the city.
- » Temporary accommodation and hotel payments cost Liverpool Council over £20million last year.
- » Lib Dems say bring derelict properties back to life to house local residents and save taxpayers millions.

ALVANLEY ROAD SPEEDING FEARS

Multiple households on Albanley Road have contacted David about speeding and heavy traffic.

Residents say that, despite the 20mph limit, too many vehicles travel too quickly, making the road feel more like a main road than a residential street.

David Brookes-Lennon said:

"Residents are right to be concerned. I am looking into what can be done to improve safety, including traffic calming, speed monitoring, better signage and a review of how the road is used."

ACTION NEEDED TO TACKLE ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Residents near the shops on Town Row have contacted David about anti-social behaviour, noise and litter.

Residents say groups gathering near the shops have caused disturbance into the evening, leaving people living nearby feeling fed up and ignored.

David and the team have already liaised with the police and are asking for extra patrols over the summer months.

David said:

"Residents should not have to put up with disruption outside their homes. We will work with local businesses to encourage regular litter clearing and discourage anti-social behaviour."

SAFETY CONCERNS AT TRIANGLE JUNCTION



Residents have raised concerns about parking and congestion at the triangle junction where **Leyfield Road, Honeys Green Lane and Yew Tree Road meet.**

At school drop-off and pick-up times, residents say the junction and surrounding roads can become filled with cars, with some vehicles mounting kerbs and making it harder for pedestrians, families and other road users to move safely.

David will be working with local schools to see how this can be addressed safely, while encouraging school drop-off drivers to park responsibly and always put safety first.
